## **Got a flu shot?** National Influenza Vaccination Week, Dec. 4-10

LAS VEGAS -- The holidays are approaching. Have you gotten a flu shot? The Southern Nevada Health District encourages everyone to protect themselves and their loved ones during the holiday season by getting a flu shot. National Influenza Vaccination Week, Dec. 4-10, is an opportunity to remind people that flu shots are beneficial and affective even if they are received in December and January. Flu shots are \$28, the inhaled vaccine is \$43, and the new high-dose shot for people 65 and older is \$53. The health district has administered more than 10,500 doses since mid-September. To date, flu activity in Southern Nevada is low so there is still time to get a flu shot before flu season peaks locally in January or February. Flu season can continue until May.

It is recommended that everyone 6 months of age and older get a yearly flu vaccination and there are ample supplies of influenza vaccine available this season. The health district encourages everyone to get flu vaccinations, especially persons at high-risk of complications from the flu including children younger than 5 (children younger than 2 years old are at highest risk), adults 65 years of age and older and pregnant women.
