RE: DIVISION OF CLINICAL SERVICES DIRECTOR REPORT

I. Immunization Program

A. Immunization Program Activities

1. The Immunization Reminder Program provided:
 - a. Five hundred successful reminder calls and postcards for adults 65 years and older with no doses of Prevnar, Pneumovax and/or Td/Tdap vaccination on October 15, 2018.
 - b. One hundred and forty successful reminder calls were made to children 19-35 months who are not up to date with their immunizations.

B. Immunization Outreach Program Activities

1. A Mobile Unit Clinic at Windmill Library was held on October 3, 2018 and October 17, 2018. A total of 19 vaccines were administered to 13 clients.
2. A Mobile Unit Clinic at Skyview YMCA was held on October 8 and October 22, 2018. A total of 31 vaccines were administered to 11 clients.
3. A Mobile Unit Clinic at Sunrise WIC was held on October 5, 2018. A total of 8 vaccines were administered to 6 clients.
4. An Immunization Clinic at Shannon West Homeless Youth Center was held on October 10, 2018. A total of 12 vaccines were administered to 4 clients.
5. An Immunization Clinic at the Downtown Recreation Center was held on October 11, 2018. A total of 7 vaccines were administered to 3 clients.
6. A Mobile Unit Clinic at Wells Park was held on October 23, 2018. A total of 3 vaccines were administered to 2 clients.
7. A Mobile Unit Clinic at Clark County Library was held on October 24, 2018. A total of 18 vaccines were administered to 9 clients.
8. Hepatitis A Campaign for Homeless in partnership with Nevada Homeless Alliance was held on October 16, 2018. A total of 21 vaccines were administered to 11 clients.
9. An Immunization Clinic in partnership with Aids Health Foundation was held on October 29, 2018. A total of 25 vaccines were administered to 13 clients.

II. Community Health Nursing

A. Maternal Child Health

1. There were one new cases of childhood lead poisoning in the month of October.
2. There were 4 new referrals from the Newborn Screening Program requiring follow-up by a field nurse.

B. Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)

The Southern Nevada Health District's Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) has 133 active clients. There are 46 clients participating through the Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) program made available through the Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health under the Affordable Care Act (ACA).

HeadsUp, College of Southern Nevada and Urban League, community partners, attended the team's staff meetings. Information on the services offered was provided including: mental health, free job training, and access to day care. This month, the program nurse home visitors were shadowed by University of Nevada at Las Vegas nursing students and new Healthy Start nurse case managers. In addition, a program nurse home visitor promoted the Nurse-Family Partnership program at a Boys Town Nevada staff meeting.

Healthy Start Initiative (HSI)

The Southern Nevada Health District's Healthy Start program has enrolled 691 at risk participants since March 2015, when enrollment began. There have been 186 infants born into the program since March 2015. At present, two case managers and the team lead are serving 194 participants total.

The SNHD's Healthy Start Initiative (HSI) team has continued ongoing activities to support families in meeting project goals to improve women's health, increase access to quality services, strengthen families' resilience, achieve collective impact and monitor performance/outcomes. The first contracted Community Health Worker is being trained to case manage a small targeted group of program participants and to conduct outreach to increase prenatal referrals. All the project's Community Health Nurse positions are filled. The project's Collective Impact organization, FamCAN, met and established an action plan for the 2018-2019 program budget year. This month's outreach included the 2018 March of Dimes Women's Health Symposium: Assuring Optimal Health Outcomes for all Moms and Babies.

III. HIV/Ryan White Care Programs

- A.** The Ryan White (RW) Case Management (MCM) program received 20 referrals for the month of October, including three pregnant women, one youth, and one newborn perinatally exposed to HIV. Newborns perinatally exposed to HIV are followed for periodic HIV screenings for approximately 4 months to determine HIV status. The MCM program continues to collaborate with UNLV Maternal Child Wellness program to provide case management and care coordination for perinatally exposed newborns and children living with HIV.
- B.** A new Administrative Assistant was hired to support the Ryan White programs and Sexual Health Clinic (SHC). The program is in the process of recruiting two Community Health Nurses and a Social Worker. These positions are grant funded.
- C.** HIV/Ryan White Care Services workforce members were invited by HRSA to be part of a panel presentation on CHW program implementation at the National Ryan White Conference in Washington DC in December 2018.
- D.** Community Health Workers continue to enhance services provided by RW Care Programs and clinic to people living with HIV (PLWH).

IV. Sexual Health Clinic

- A. There were 905 patient visits in Sexual Health Clinic (SHC).
- B. SHC welcomed two medical assistants to the team this month.
- C. SHC expanded insurance billing for those seeking STD testing and treatment services on 10/09/2018.
- D. PrEP services have more than doubled since 06/01/2018. This service provides HIV medication to high risk individuals for HIV infection.

V. Tuberculosis Clinic/Refugee Health Program

- A. Seven new active adult TB cases were reported by the TB Clinic during this period. There were no new pediatric TB cases
- B. The Refugee Health Program served 40 adult clients.

VI. Teen Pregnancy Prevention (TPP)

- A. The TPP program and grant partners continue full program and grant activities at the Juvenile Justice System, Department of Family Services, and other community based organizations in the community.
- B. Special Projects, Reports/Events: During October there were no projects or events to report.
- C. During October, through the TPP program's social media campaign the THNKnevada Facebook page achieved a total of 5 new likes for a total of 6119 likes. The twitter account reached 727 followers and has 104 impressions. The THNK website had 179 unique users, 123 new users and 13 returning users. The Instagram page reached 736 followers and 96 youth were engaged.

VII. Family Planning (FP)

- A. FP Program services at East Las Vegas and Decatur Public Health Centers served 548 clients; 529 of them were unduplicated.
- B. The East Las Vegas Family Planning Clinic served 263 clients; 254 of them were unduplicated.
- C. The Decatur Family Planning clinic served 285 clients; 275 of them were unduplicated.

VIII. Family Health Clinic

- A. The Family Health Care Clinic served 46 patients in the month of October. Twenty-eight patients were age 18 or younger and 18 patients were adults. Immunizations were administered by the Immunization Clinic in conjunction with client physical exams.
- B. Family Health Care Clinic providers served 13 children of refugee clients for well child visits and health screenings.

IV. Pharmacy Services

- A. Dispensed 363 prescriptions for 260 clients.
- B. Assessed/counseled 15 clients in the Ryan White-Sexual Health Clinic.
- C. Assessed/counseled 32 clients in the Tuberculosis Clinic.
- D. Assisted 24 clients to obtain medication financial assistance.
- E. Assisted 2 clients with insurance approvals.
- F. Referred 2 clients to community partners.

X. Clinical Services Administration

- A. Clinical Services Division continues to retain Nevada State Board of Nursing approval to provide Continuing Education credits for SNHD Nursing staff. There were no CEU's offered in October.
