RE: DIVISION OF CLINICAL SERVICES DIRECTOR REPORT

I. Immunization Program

A. Immunization Program Activities

1. The Immunization Reminder Program provided:

- a. 59 successful reminder calls and postcards for children 6 weeks through 4 years without appropriate number of Prevnar doses on January 15, 2019.
- b. 135 successful reminder calls were made to children 19-35 months who are not up to date with their immunizations.

B. Immunization Outreach Program Activities

- Immunization Clinic at the Mexican Consulate on January 14, 2019 provided 96 vaccines to 41 clients.
- 2. January 2019 Mobile Unit Clinics provided 51 vaccines to 23 clients.
- 3. Immunization Clinic at Salvation Army Pop-Up Clinic on January 15, 2019 provided 20 vaccines to 8 clients.
- 4. Immunization Clinic at Shannon West Homeless Youth Center on January 30, 2019 provided 5 vaccines to 2 clients.

II. Community Health Nursing

A. Maternal Child Health

- 1. There were no new reported cases of childhood lead poisoning in the month of January.
- 2. There was one referral from the Newborn Screening Program requiring follow-up by the field nurse.

B. Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)

The Southern Nevada Health District's Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) has 149 active clients. Forty-five are participating through the Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) Program made available through the Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health under the Affordable Care Act (ACA).

C. Healthy Start Initiative (HSI)

The Southern Nevada Health District's Healthy Start program has enrolled 727 at risk participants since March 2015, when enrollment began. 196 infants have been born into the

program since March 2015. At present, four case managers and team lead are serving 185 participants total.

The SNHD's Healthy Start Initiative (HSI) team has continued ongoing activities to support families in meeting project goals to improve women's health, increase access to quality services, strengthen families' resilience, achieve collective impact and monitor performance/outcomes. The project's nurse case managers are currently providing home visiting services to 185 families. Outreach this month included 8 individual locations to obtain program champions for recruitment and awareness of the Healthy Start Program. Outreach included Sunrise Children's Foundation WIC at specific locations within target zip codes. Outreach to Sunrise WIC is with the goal of establishing a recruitment satellite site for the program and Nurse Family Partnership.

III. HIV/Ryan White Care Programs

- A. The HIV/Case Management (MCM) program received 25 referrals in January, including three pregnant women and two newborns with perinatal HIV exposure. Newborns perinatally exposed to HIV are followed for periodic testing for approximately four months to determine their HIV status. The Nurse Case Management (NCM) team provides on-call coverage for hospitals reporting births to women presenting in labor and are known to either have a HIV diagnosis or a test positive for HIV. The team continues to collaborate with the UNLV Maternal Child Wellness program to provide case management and care coordination for perinatally exposed newborns and children living with HIV.
- B. One Community Health Worker (CHW) presented at the Ryan White conference in Washington DC in December. He participated in a panel discussion with other CHW's and the HRSA project officer. The program manager presented on experiences with CHW implementation at the same conference.
- C. Four Ryan White workforce members attended a Community Health Worker's learning session in Boston funded by Boston University grant.

IV. Sexual Health Clinic (STD Care Services)

- A. The Sexual Health Clinic (SHC) provided direct clinical services to 1185 client in the month of January.
- B. HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) and post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) continue to be offered at the SHC. PrEP, PEP, and Hepatitis services continue to increase as the community becomes more aware of available services.
- C. SHC staff attended a webinar on Intimate Partner Violence. The program manager and one team leader attended a leadership training provided by SNHD Human Resources.

V. Tuberculosis Clinic/Refugee Health Program

- A. One new active adult TB case was reported by the TB Clinic during this period. There were no new pediatric TB cases.
- B. The Refugee Health Program served 31 adults in January.

VI. Teen Pregnancy Prevention (TPP)

- A. The TPP program and community partners continue full program and grant activities at the Juvenile Justice System, Department of Family Services, and other community- based organizations.
- B. Special Projects, Reports/Events: During December, the TPP program conducted outreach activities at Las Vegas High School and Chaparral High School. TPP provided information and resources to 235 individuals.
- C. During January, through the TPP program's social media campaign the THNKnevada Facebook page has a total of 6,027 likes. The twitter account has 706 followers and had 4,433 impressions. The THNK website had 203 unique pageviews, 109 new users and 13 returning users. The Instagram page reached 830 followers and 892 youth were engaged.

VII. Family Planning (FP)

- A. FP Program services at East Las Vegas and Decatur Public Health Centers served 199 clients; 195 of them were unduplicated.
- B. The East Las Vegas Family Planning Clinic served 76 clients; 76 of them were unduplicated.
- C. The Decatur Family Planning clinic served 123 clients; 119 of them unduplicated.

VIII. Family Health Clinic

A. The Family Health Care Clinic saw 110 patients in the month of January. Thirty-three patients were age 18 or younger and includes 8 children from the Refugee Clinic. Seventy-seven patients were age 19 or older. Immunizations were offered to those in need, according to the ACIP recommended Immunization Schedule.

IV. Pharmacy Services

- A. Dispensed 396 prescriptions for 293 clients.
- B. Assessed/counseled 23 clients in the Ryan White-Sexual Health Clinic.
- C. Assessed/counseled 22 clients in the Tuberculosis Clinic.
- D. Assisted 37 clients with insurance approvals.
- E. Assisted 3 clients with insurance approvals.
- F. Referred 0 clients to community partners.

X. Clinical Services Administration

A. Clinical Services Division continues to retain Nevada State Board of Nursing approval to provide Continuing Education credits for SNHD Nursing staff. There were no CEU's offered in January.
