SNHD Pediatric Early Warning Sentinel Surveillance (PEWSS) Report: July 05, 2012

General Update

During the week ending June 30, 2012, the following viruses were identified through PEWSS with a moderate volume of testing (Fig. 1): Influenza B, Adenovirus and Parainfluenza 3.

Over the past five weeks (Tables 1 & 2), the following were identified in the community through PEWSS: Influenza B and Adenovirus have been circulating at low levels.

Influenza A, Human Metapneumovirus, Parainfluenza 2, Parainfluenza 3 and RSV have been sporadically identified. Parainfluenza 1 has not been identified.

Figure 1 - Weekly Number of Specimens Tested






Figure 2. Weekly Positive Counts for Organisms Tested Influenza A □ A H3 ■ A 2009 H1N1 10 0 20 Influenza B 10 0 10 **Adenovirus** 10 **Human Metapneumo** 0 10 Parainfluenza 1 0 10 Parainfluenza 2 0 10 Parainfluenza 3 0 20 **RSV** 10 7/9 8/6 9/3 10/1 10/29 11/26 12/24 1/21 3/17 4/14 5/12 6/9 Week Ending Date (2011-2012)
