General Update

During the week ending April 20, 2013, the following viruses were identified through PEWSS with a low volume of testing (Fig. 1): Influenza B, Human Metapneumovirus and RSV.

Over the past five weeks (Tables 1 & 2), the following were identified in the community through PEWSS: Influenza B has been circulating at high levels.

Adenovirus and Parainfluenza 3 have been circulating at low levels.

Influenza A, Human Metapneumovirus and RSV have been sporadically identified.

Parainfluenza 1 and Parainfluenza 2 have not been identified.



Other News and Information

Influenza B continues to circulate at a high level in Southern Nevada (Table 1). Last year, PEWSS detected influenza A and B in the community as late as July (Fig. 2).

Influenza viruses that circulate widely among people worldwide during 2012-2013 include influenza A (H3N2), A 2009 (H1N1), and two genetic lineages of influenza B viruses (Yamagata and Victoria).
